Ladies and Gentlemen

Good morning and Sawadee Khup

Collaboration of TROPMED with People's Republic of China started in Traiditonal Medicine through the ASEAN —CHINA Centre. Let me also mention here that the Network in fulfilling its mandate, places a high premium on its internal capacity building as evidenced by activities undertaken for its own human resource by the Centres and by the Network Office.

The report of accomplishments for 2016-2017 to be presented by the Centres and the

Network Office later in the Business Meeting will attest how TROPMED Network fulfilled its mandate and contributed towards improving the quality of life of the people in the region.
